Inspired by the fluid strokes of a pointed brush, I envisioned a typeface combining dynamic curves with a formal structure. After numerous attempts and much learning, I revisited Nave several times, each time refining the design. A breakthrough came when I was examining how Futura Black looks like its shapes are cut from blocks, guiding my approach to the uppercase letters. Today, Nave stands as a harmonious blend of tradition and creativity, ready to bring elegance and flair to any project.
